The methodology of Cleary University is to distribute \$500 grant dollars per Pell and SEOG eligible students, \$300 grant dollars to Title IV eligible students who only received loans, and \$175 grant dollars to all other eligible students.

In March of 2020, Congress passed the CARES Act, which includes the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund.
