The methodology of Cleary University is to distribute \$450 grant dollars per Pell and SEOG eligible students, \$200 grant dollars to Title IV eligible students who had received loans, and \$100 grant dollars to all other eligible students. Students with financial hardship due to Covid19 received a 75/25 percent match of outstanding balance.

<u>Instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students</u> concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants:

The Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II (HEERF II) is authorized by the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2021 (CRRSAA), Public Law 116-260, signed into law on Dec. 27, 2020. In total, the CRRSAA authorizes \$81.88 billion in support for education, in addition to the \$30.75 billion expeditiously provided last spring through the Coronavirus Aid, Recovery, and Economic Security (CARES) Act, Public Law 116-136.
